ACTIVATION AND OPERATION

BATTERY CHANGE INSTRUCTIONS

Both the non-rechargeable PF-200 and the rechargeable PF-200R are activated by a push-button located on the face of the unit (figure 1). There are many built in flash patterns that are selected "round robin" each time the button is pushed.

To turn the light off, you can 1) hold the button down or 2) simply click until the "off" position is reached. If you hold the button down to turn it off, the unit will come back on in the last pattern you used.

Tactical Flash: When the unit is off, holding the power button down will produce a bright. momentary flash.




When putting the unit back together, be sure the black O-ring is properly seated in the groove in the lid. You can lubricate this O-ring by applying a small amount of appropriate silicone or water-based (not petroleum) "gasket lube" (used with many SCUBA diving flashlights, etc.) Also place a small amount of lube on the areas of the case under the screw heads.

Failure to properly re-seat the O-ring and lubricate may cause the unit to no longer be waterproof. NOTE: This model is rated as waterproof to 80'. The unit may switch modes/off at areater depth.

Align the lid with the body-case and push back together with your fingers. Make sure the lid is completely flush with the suface of the unit body. Gently tighten each screw. Overtightening may break the aluminum screw. Replacements available

Remove the battery by holding down the top of the battery box and pulling up on the rubber sleeve (figure 4) around the battery. Note the polarity indicators. There is a "+" sign on the battery box. Save and reuse the rubber sleeve on the replacement battery.
